

## **TACAC Conference Session Proposal Guidelines 2026**

- Session topics should address issues related to college admission counseling including but not limited to: transfer students, international students, access to higher education, best practices in the field, self-care, time management, technology in college admission counseling, standardized testing, financial aid and affordability, best practices in preparing applications, NCAA updates, recruitment and college counseling in uncertain campus climates, working with parents in the college process, campus visits, ethical, legal, and relevant policy issues or anything that may be helpful for high school or college admissions personnel.
- Individual submissions are fine, but we strongly encourage partnering with peers at other institutions or organizations.
- Please limit session proposals to two (2) per person.
- In addition to the title, description, audience, and topics covered in your proposed session, we will ask for information about each additional presenter in your session, including their name and institution.
- Please provide an email address that you check regularly. All
  correspondence for sessions will be sent to the email address provided
  by the lead presenter.
- Presentations should be interactive when possible and allow for questions from the audience.
- Presenters are required to register for the conference in McAllen, TX.

  Presenters must be available to present either Sunday, April 12 or Monday,

  April 13, 2026. Presenters do not receive a discounted registration rate.
- Presenters must provide their own laptop and HDMI cord. Projectors are provided by TACAC. There is basic internet access available in meeting rooms.
- Presenters are responsible for providing their own handouts to session attendees, though any presentations provided will be posted on the conference app for access during and post-conference.
